What is "Offshore Racing"?

Offshore & Oceanic Sailing

World Sailing promotes Oceanic and Offshore racing and cruising around the world. Oceanic racing is defined as any offshore race over 800 miles.

There are many types of Oceanic and Offshore racing events which are organised for one design classes as well as handicap or rating systems. In order to achieve an orderly schedule, World Sailing works with event organisers to monitor the calendar of events. The differences between the types of Oceanic and Offshore racing, ranging from trans-oceanic racing to short-course day races sailed in protected waters, are reflected in the six categories of the World Sailing Offshore Special Regulations which provide for the differences in the minimum standards of safety and accommodation.





What is "Offshore Racing"?



Offshore Racing

Racing in any boats capable of complying with requirements of **Category 4** of the **Offshore Special Regulations**.





World Sailing's Offshore Special Regulations (OSR)

US Sailing's Safety
Equipment Requirements
(SER)

"The SER committee has the objectives of meeting the needs of the US Offshore Community and as far as possible maintaining compatibility with the World Sailing OSRs. It is a goal that US offshore race boats can compete internationally without modification, and that international boats can compete without US events modification."

A Comparison

"Course" Racing

- Broadly, the intent is to sail a course aligned with the wind direction
 - Certainly, Upwind, downwind and possibly off wind
- Short(er) ~ 60 minutes or less
- Multiple races per day
- Multiple times around the course during race
- Often, ability to change the course to maintain wind direction.
- Often ability to shorten course
- OSR Cat 4 or 5 for keelboats


"Offshore" Racing

- Broadly, the intent to sail a course with a defined course/destination regardless of the wind direction
 - Could only be one point of sail
- Long(er) ~ several hours upwards to around the world
- Standalone event or one race per day if part of a larger event
- OSR Cat 4 and lower for keelboats
 - Perhaps OSR Cat 3

Often a regatta may consist of a series of course races and one or more distance ("offshore") races



What is AHMEN?





The nine larger marks are AHMEN marks of the course, each with listed latitude and longitude coordinates.

The smaller marks are included as aids to visual navigation only.

Crew Size Potential

- Offshore racing can allow & events often support different crew size
- General Crew Size Options
 - Fully Crewed (FC)
 - Double Handed (SH)
 - Rising in popularity
 - Single Handed (SH)/Solo
 - Great Lakes Singlehanded Society (GLSS) <u>www.solosailors.org</u>

- Shaded, black or gray, indicates an overnight/multiday race or one race in the series is overnight/multiday, respectively

 - Windsor/Sarnia & Lake Huron





- Congratulations, you may have already done so with out realizing it!
- Look at the <u>characteristics</u> of the event, not its label!
- Select events with characteristics that work for you and that you are comfortable with. Work your way up the Offshore ladder!
- Looking to crew, check and/or post on event's crewbank
 - Develop prerequires that enhance your value as crew, e.g. Offshore Personal Survival Courses

LOSHRS Mentor Class

- Intended to support experienced sailors to start racing singlehanded or doublehanded.
- Always an addition person onboard to provide moral support as mentor or adviser – Can not do any sailing or racing activities other than provide advice or knowledge
- Person-in-Charge needs to meet PHRF-LO's definition of a "New Racer"
- Applies only to LOSHRS Day Races
- No Flying Sails (NFS) only either single or doublehanded



Ontario Sailing Services -For the (Offshore) Racer

- Provincial Sports Organization (PSO) for sailing, including racing, in Ontario
- Represents the needs of boaters and yacht clubs to the provincial government
- With conjunction with Sail Canada, certify sport officials such race officers and judges
- Provides the first tier, provincial, of the appeals process for the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- Arranges and coordinates the Personal Survival Courses

This is a Sail Canada Course



One Day Course

Two Day Course



Includes both classroom and practical components



Learn about the equipment you have on your boat and how to use flares, cut your rig, and fight fires.



A portion of the course takes place in a pool where participants swim in sailing gear and lifejacket/PFD and board a raft.



Certification is valid for 5 years

 - Cost \$565+HST








Who should take these course?
